Saved by Faith - A Study through Galatians for Kids!

Galatians 2:11-21

Discussion Questions

After reading this lesson's scripture, discuss these with your kids!

1. Paul confronted Peter (also known as Cephas) in front of the other leaders. What was the question Paul asked Peter? (v. 14)
2. The word justified means being made right with God. How are we justified with God? (v. 16)
3. When Jesus Christ lives in us, what kind of life do we live? (v. 20) Share with each other what Jesus has done for you.

Craft Time

Items Needed:

- Construction paper
- Pasta & glue
- Markers

"Pasta Cross" Craft – Make a pasta cross craft to remind you of the new life you have in Jesus.

- First, outline a cross on a piece of paper.
- Next, decorate the cross by gluing several pieces of pasta onto the cross. If available, use a variety of pasta shapes and sizes.
- Finally, write at the bottom of the paper, "And the life I now live in the flesh I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave himself for me." Galatians 2:20b.

Let's Play

Items Needed:

- Food

"Impossible to Follow!" Game – This game is all about trying to follow some impossible rules! Select one person to be the "Rule Giver" who will read out loud the below impossible rules. The other family members will try to follow the rules!

- Lick your elbow with your tongue. Wiggle your ears without touching them.
- Jump 5-feet high in the air! Stare at each other for one minute without blinking.
- Use only your toes to feed yourself a piece of food.

Here's an idea to try!

"Tear it Down!"– In verses 18-21, Paul teaches that it was impossible to follow the Law in order to be saved. In fact, Jesus had tore down the need to follow the Law in order to be saved. We are only saved by faith in Jesus Christ. So, conduct some "Tear it Down" races by stacking various objects to create a structure. Ideas for objects include: blocks, Legos, pillows, books, magazines etc. On "Go" tear it down! First one to tear down the built-up structure, wins!
